all three regions will be participating. We need to increase our pool of commissioned presenters. Ten participants have registered.

This event is being planned for the spring of that year; however, we have not yet worked out all the details concerning the date and venue. At this point, we are looking at places in the Central Region and a date shortly after the Victoria Day holiday in May. We'll provide all relevant details as soon as we know them ourselves. The Centering Prayer groups are winding down this time of year and looking forward to a more leisurely pace, vacation time spent with family and friends, and the renewal that seems to be part of the summer months for many of us.

At our meeting with the Service Team members and the facilitators, which was held in Chatham on May 16, 2017, we reviewed each of the events and activities of the past year. After evaluation, we made the decision to continue with the following throughout 2017-2018.

As many of you are aware, over the past year the Leadership Team of the Southwestern Ontario Chapter of Contemplative Outreach (SWOCCO) has been seeking to recruit a new coordinator for this region.

In 2005, Rose-Marie McIsaac (RIP) asked me to assume the responsibilities of coordinator and to work with her and Father Joe Quinn to grow Centering Prayer in this area. The Holy Spirit has been working in the midst of our network almost imperceptibly at times, and so deeply and powerfully at other times. Last May, at the Ontario Conference of Contemplative Outreach called "Second Wind," the decision was made to invite the coordinators of the three regions of Ontario to form a Contemplative Outreach Ontario Service Team for a period of two years. I accepted the invitation and also made the decision to resign as coordinator of SWOCCO, effective June 30, 2017.

I am pleased that Rev. Kevin Steeper, M.Div., M.Ed., M.A., Dipl. Spir. Dir., who is Minister at Lakeshore United Church in Goderich, has agreed to take on the role of coordinator for the Southwestern Ontario Chapter of Contemplative Outreach. The Service Team and Facilitators were unanimous in supporting him for the position of coordinator, effective June 30, 2017.

Kevin will be receiving the necessary papers from Claire Eng of CO International. These will confirm his position as coordinator of SWOCCO, effective June 30, 2017.

As a very brief introduction to Kevin for those of you who may not know him, we met Kevin when he was pastor in London, Ontario some ten or eleven years ago. He wanted to introduce Centering Prayer to his congregation, and arranged for Rose-Marie and me to conduct an Introductory Workshop for his congregation. Out of that experience, a Centering Prayer group was formed. Recently he has transferred to

Lakeshore United Church in Goderich. The group in London continues to function well with established members and a new facilitator.

Kevin is very committed to Centering Prayer as a way of life and to sharing the gift of Centering Prayer with others. He has been very generous in his support of Centering Prayer in our area and has been on the Service Team for five years. Kevin meets the prerequisites for coordinator as suggested in the CO Resource Manual and is well qualified for the position. I'm sure you will be hearing from him in future Newsletters.

I felt surrounded with support and friendship from those practicing Centering Prayer, from the leaders of Contemplative Outreach locally, as well as internationally especially Susan Komis, Bonnie Shimizu, Claire Eng (we started SWOCCO together) – and the many colleagues I was fortunate to work with and learn from along the way. I am very grateful for the grace-filled experiences over the years and I look forward to supporting and contributing to Contemplative Outreach in a different capacity now. Thank you so much for your prayers, challenges, help, generosity, and support over the years. Without you and the grace of God, it would have been impossible. God bless.

CENTRAL

The Contemplative Outreach Central Ontario (COCO) Servant Leadership Team met on January 28 and April 22, 2017, and a third meeting is planned for August 26. I'm pleased to report that we now have two very committed new members: Rev. Stuart Pike (Burlington) and Sue Woollard (Brampton). It's great to have increased our number so that we can better serve our ever-expanding COCO community. As you'll see in *Seeds Sown*, on page 5, there are now four new groups; these are located in Oshawa, Port Hope, Port Perry and Toronto (downtown).

Given the fact that, at least for now, the Newsletter is published only twice a year, we felt the need to have another channel of communication – a bit less formal – that would serve the COCO community and could be ready in less time than the COO Newsletter. That is why we decided, back in January, to issue a "COCO News Flash" roughly every two months. Thus far, we have published it in February, April and June-July 2017.

Also, in order to deepen the connection between our groups, Marilyn Brandon, who is in charge of the facilitator training for COCO, had a brain wave earlier this year, suggesting that we interview each facilitator and present a "group feature" every month or so. The Markdale Group was the first one featured, followed by the St. John's group (in the East end of Toronto), the Markham-Unionville group in Scarborough and the St. Catharines group.

The Niagara region, under the skilled stewardship of Brenda Coleman, is particularly active. For future Newsletters, one member, Jennifer Pothier, has agreed to be the "Niagara Reporter." In the meantime, I am pleased to report that in that region, there was a Christmas potluck, a full Day of Reflection in March and a "planning-closing" potluck before an Introductory Workshop in July 2017.

Talking of Introductory Workshops, there was also one in Oshawa in February 2017. A third one is planned in Lindsay this fall.

Last fall in Toronto we met Nestor de Armas, who is in charge of the facilitator training for Contemplative Outreach Limited in the United States. Nestor asked whether we would like to pilot a facilitator training program that will eventually be made available online. We accepted enthusiastically, and Marilyn Brandon and Mary Catherine Doyle did an outstanding job organizing this event in July; 12 people attended. To be continued...

Gregor Sneddon (founder of COEO and past coordinator) was the presenter. This year, we had a deep sense that a retreat on silence could emerge, once again, from within our own community of prayer.

Overwhelmingly, the response in the feedback was a resounding confirmation of this and gratitude for the opportunity to listen to and serve the Silence, "to live and move and have our being" in the Silence. We heard in our feedback and hear often enough that folks want a chance to practice. And to practice with others is deeply encouraging and supportive for when we are back home and on our own.

We are happy to have a new member join us – Rev. Mary Ellen Berry. We have both registered for the Presenters Training weekend this August and most likely will present an Introduction to CP workshop as one of our first Pilgrim's Way days early in the autumn. Hélène Goulet (a Leadership

Team member and liaison with CP Western Quebec) will be our mentor.

An Advent Day is always well received. This will be followed with the planning for our 2018 Lenten retreat – perhaps a Centering Prayer Intensive? Stay tuned!

Indeed, I say with deep appreciation and admiration that this small CO servant group is abundantly blessed in the company of one another, in prayer, in conversation, in planning on behalf of those in this neck of the woods for whom Centering Prayer is elemental to daily life.
